### Rapid Access Treatment Team Clinician (Triage Clinician)

The Rapid Access Treatment Team Clinician (RATT) is a full-time, 12 month appointment in the Counseling Service division of the University of Maryland's Counseling Center. The RATT clinician functions as a part of the RATT team and is responsible for the provision of rapid access treatment modalities to students at UMD. The RATT clinician reports to the Associate Director of the Counseling Center.

### Essential Duties and Responsibilities

1. Screens emergent, urgent, and routine concerns and makes appropriate clinical decisions for treatment.
2. Provides single session therapy to appropriate clients.
3. Leads clinical workshops.
4. Provides drop-in consultation on and off-site at various locations on campus.
5. Documents clinical information keeps timely records and safeguards confidentiality of this information.
6. Collaborates with psychologists, care manager, and other Counseling Center staff concerning the continuity of care, client dispositions, and referral options.
7. Attends staff meetings, serves on Counseling Center and Student Affairs committees, and participates in Center-related activities and other duties as assigned.
8. Assists in the development of policies and procedures governing the operation of the Rapid Access Treatment Team.
9. Other duties as assigned.

### Required Qualifications

1. Master's degree in Social Work, Clinical or Counseling Psychology or a related field. Degree must be from an accredited academic program.
2. Must be licensed or license eligible (should be able to transfer their existing license to MD) at a clinical level (LCSW/ LCPC) in the State of Maryland within 6 months of hire.

### Preferred Qualifications

1. Experience working with college students and general knowledge of collegiate mental health as a field.
2. Experience working in a mental health setting with diverse populations.
3. Experience providing emergency services

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
